#### **Projects**

#### Calendar 2022

Very successful sold out quickly, accounts to be finalised.

#### Calendar 2023

PW suggested that the photographs submitted should be categorised every 3 months. NW, in an email, said that he was happy for a person (or persons) to be the nominated adjudicator on reviewing which pics are worthy of consideration for inclusion.

#### Tree Planting

This is a long term project aiming to green up some areas in need of TLC with great benefit to the environment.

Bovis Homes sites to be planted Essington 2<sup>nd</sup> March, Wombourne 3<sup>rd</sup> March. Bovis Homes have a dedicated team for tree planting and we can have any input we like, just visit the site, help out or take photographs. These tree planting sites were initiated by the FOE and Bovis are now planting other sites across the country. The Broadlands site will be investigated and be planted in the next season. The original suggestion of planting on the Cannock Road was refused and has now been transferred to the corner of Cannock Road and Moseley Road and down the Cannock Road towards the industrial estate island. 30 trees will be planted on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> February at 10am, some local residents have been asked to help along with Benniman Construction and any help from the committee would be appreciated. The trees to be planted are 10 each of Carpinus betulus, Acer campestre and Quercus robur. Prior to this the area will be strimmed as approved in the previous meeting. The other sites on the tree planting scheme will be further investigated when the time gets nearer to planting.

As PW commented at the last meeting about developers and the council, hopefully from our lead on the Bovis sites it may encourage the council to insist that the developer includes tree planting in their planning. The trees have been supplied FOC

from the Forest of Mercia with a maintenance plan and have visited the sited to see suitability and the types of trees. They will also be delivering the trees on Thursday and helping with the planting. The Highways Department have visited the sites and have given their approval.

#### **Bulb Planting**

WW to resend bulb planting scheme but basically this is following the tree planting scheme with suitable bulbs for the different areas. The first area where the trees were going to be planted down the Cannock Road would lend itself to the planting of crocuses. This needs further investigation.

#### Bulb Planting this season

- 1. The bench and the bottom of Windmill Hill planted with crocuses CR & DR.
- 2. The entrance to Hilton Cross Industrial Estate Island, planted with daffodils with help from Bennimans construction.
- 3. Broad Lane Essington/Bloxwich border planted with daffodils NW & JH.
- 4. Halfway up Broad Lane by the traffic controlling chicane with help from local residents.
- 5. Bottom of Old Hampton Lane planted with Alliums and Snake's Head Fritillary.
- 6. Broad Lane around the Springhill sign this area was strimmed, planted with daffodils and the sign cleaned CR & DR.
- 7. The bottom of Blackhalve Lane the Staffordshire sign area was strimmed, planted with daffodils and the sign cleaned CR & DR.

AN sent out the Local Plan Review and response about Broad Lane. We can only add that it is in need of some vast improvement and in our small way have tried to brighten the area with the bulb planting - various items were discussed. The whole area needs a litter pick among other things.

## Triangle

Looking good with daffodil bulbs coming up.

AN looking at various timbers for the structures - he will keep us informed.

## Windmill Hill Bench and Bottom of Old Hampton Lane

Tony Stanley to continue maintaining these areas for the next year.

#### Orchard

This is an update from an email by NW:- Myself, Jon, Wilson and Paul spent several hours cutting back the surrounding trees and hedges, and pruning the fruit trees. We have agreed with the Facilities Manager and the Caretaker that we will visit monthly to keep on top of it. Next time we visit we will install the sign. I will arrange to collect it from Colin before then. Myself and Jon are happy to be considered the stakeholders for this project. We will feedback any developments. CR replied to NW with a thank you to everyone involved and he also thanked them at the meeting.

#### Brownshore Crossing
