1. Matters arising from the record of the last meeting.

<u>Projects</u>

Calendar 2023

NW sent out chart of favourite photographs, this was discussed and a couple were judged as inappropriate. It was stated that there weren't enough to judge from and they were pretty much the same mainly based on the pools area. It was suggested that archive photographs would be entered into the mix and also more photographs could be entered up until August and viewed as we have done in the past. It was also suggested by NW in email that this was not the BBC Countryfile calendar and he would be happy to revert to a subcommittee as we have used in the past. All agreed that this had worked. WW to liaise with NW. September meeting for final judging.

Tree Planting

This is a long term project aiming to green up some areas in need of TLC. Plant naturally, less maintenance and best for the environment. All permissions and advice needed from the Highways Department and Forest of Mercia.

Bulb Planting

WW to reassess bulb planting areas. Planting crocuses in the central grassed area near where the trees have been planted. This will need further investigation.

A decision to be made early so bulbs can be ordered in good time.

Triangle

AN had asked for £200 to be allocated for plants - all agreed but only £60 was needed. WW contacted Ashmore Glass and mentioned to them the £400 promised to help in refurbishment and the sponsorship signage moved and replaced as necessary (at a cost). When Ashmore Glass responded to WW they explained that they had a rates bill dating back to their original sponsorship date and they felt it no longer cost effective to carry on with their sponsorship. WW wished them all the best and said that he would keep in contact with them in the future and that there were no hard feelings.

New sponsorship has been obtained for 2 definite areas and the third area under discussion and WW's gardening company will maintain the areas with the approval of the new sponsor. Highways department will be contacted with regard to the above and also the repositioning of the signage. WW's gardening company will start maintenance programme immediately. NW will repaint the finger post.

Orchard

TT updated us and said that the school safety officer wanted to inspect and advise what needs doing to create safe paths so that the pupils can start to visit.

Lock-up
