Projects

Tree Planting

Bulb Planting

Orchard

Golf Course Burnsnips Road

Ongoing - AN awaiting a reply from a county councillor as it is the county's responsibility. Discussion regarding many aspects - material being land filled, number of HGV's going through the village. However this was checked by the district council and all the paper work was in order. Another concern was the continuing extensions of the land fill operation, however it was thought that council officials and all councillors should be representative of what the population of the village feel.
