Miners Monument

PWo purchased the blocks, which have now been laid on the base by PWo & PWa. PWo is talking to a bricklayer who may be able to put an initial course of bricks down so that the 'monument bricks' can be installed. PWa has agreed the donation of all bricks required from Ibstock in Cheslyn Hay, and is liaising with them.
